#### lack + Outstanding Jamaican High School Students Receive Scholarships to Study in the USA

Two of Jamaica's outstanding high school scholars will soon be in the United States studying at very prestigious universities. Jamaica College's J'voughnn Blake will be attending the Ivy League Dartmouth College, and Mount Alvernia High School student Tiana Dinham will be attending the University of North Carolina (UNC) at Chapel Hill in August. Tiana will create history by being the first student from a Jamaican school to enter on a Robertson scholarship tenable at that US-based institution.



**Tiana Dinham** also created history for being the first student attending a school in the island to have won the Johnson scholarship to study at the Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia. Apart from those two prestigious scholarships, Tiana was also successful in getting a full scholarship from Dermot College, also in the US, and another from the University of British Columbia in Canada. Tiana will be studying health policy and management with a minor in exercise and sports science, and later medicine.

J'voughnn Blake, also a formidable athlete, is ranked number four on the World Athletics Under-20 men's 800m ratings, won the boys' Class One 800m/1500m double at the Inter-secondary

Schools Sports Association/GraceKennedy Boys' and Girls' Athletics Championships in mid-April and the CARIFTA Games Under-20 double a week later. He wrapped up his high school career at the recent Penn Relays in Philadelphia, leading the Jamaica College 4x800m team to victory in the High School Boys Championships of Americas final at Franklin Field in Philadelphia, running 7:28.38 minutes, the third fastest time ever at the Penn Relays. His scholastic achievement includes 19 Caribbean Examinations Council (CXC), 13 Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC), and six Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination (CAPE) subjects. He hopes to study either molecular and cellular biology or astrophysics.



#### ♣ Recent Academic Ranking of 10 Best High Schools in Jamaica

A recent article (**Top 10 Best High Schools in Jamaica by Academic Ranking For 2022),** that was published by <a href="https://3oceansvibe.com/">https://3oceansvibe.com/</a> listed the top ten high schools in Jamaica. To determine the best high schools by academic ranking, the researchers used a system that included the percentage of students passing five or more subjects including Mathematics and English. Information from the report and the rankings are presented below.

1. Campion College has a reputation for being among the top 3 choices for PEP exams. It is also the best when it comes to academic performance especially in Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) and Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examinations (CAPE).



2. Immaculate Conception High School is a school for only girls



and currently has over one thousand girls. The outstanding academic performance of this school makes it worthy of its #2 position.

**3. St. Andrew High School** is another all-girls high

school. All school activities are funded by the government of Jamaica and is the best government school by academic ranking.



4. Hampton School is an all-girls boarding school in the parish of St. Elizabeth. Looking back in history, you can say this school is one of the oldest boarding schools in Jamaica. This school is not only old, but also one of the best when it comes to the top-performing schools in Jamaica. This school is known for producing outstanding results every single year.



5. Knox College in Spalding, Clarendon is a private co-educational high school for both day and



boarders. The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands own and manage this college hence, making it a complete private high school. The records show it to be the only co-educational boarding high school in Jamaica currently. With students from Jamaica and other Islands, it seems just right to still maintain the boarding facilities.

6. Mount Alvernia High School, while being one of the best in academic performance, the success rate in extra-curricular activities makes it one of the best when it comes to interschool competitions. The young ladies who graduate this high school stand out in society due to the high Christian grooming methods employed by the management.



7. Glenmuir High School is an Anglican co-educational school that has a reputation for being among the top three performing schools in Jamaica most of the time. Currently, the school slots number 7 but it has been on the top three list a few times back. The school adheres to a strict code of conduct which makes the students stand out in society.



8. Montego Bay High School is a government all-girls high school in Montego Bay. Montego Bay High School has received awards on several occasions for best performance in CXC examinations. You can locate Montego Bay High School at 51 Union Street, Montego Bay, St. James, Jamaica.



9. Wolmer's Girls High School is also part of the Wolmer's Schools. Wolmer's Schools consist of a Pre-School, a Preparatory school, a high school for girls, and another high school for boys only. This school accepts students from all over the Caribbean and gives them quality education. It is one of the best girls' schools in Jamaica when it comes to academic performance.



**10. Wolmer's Boys School** is the male counterpart for Wolmer's Girls' School while performing on par with the female counterparts academically, is also one of the best when it comes to extracurricular activities.

In short, all the schools on this list are good and all the others that did not make it here are also good. Sometimes just a bit of extra effort from students makes the difference on the ranking table. Most of the schools on this list are single-gender schools which are making more people develop an interest in single-gender schools than co-educational schools. 

Legendary national footballer **Dennis "Den" Hutchinson** has died. The 63-year-old football star and basketball coach died on Tuesday, May 31, 2022. Hutchinson made a name for himself being a part of the famous Clarendon College 1977 all-island champion team, dubbed one of the best schoolboy teams ever. He is one of a few players to have won both







Church Teachers' College Alumni Association (CTCAA) mourns the passing of the **Rev Dr. Kenneth Thaxter**, past principal of Church Teachers' College; Mandeville. In an editorial in the *Daily Gleaner on* May 31, 2022, Dr. Devon Crossfield, president of the CTCAA, noted that Dr. Thaxter or 'KenT', as he was af-



fectionately called, was one of the 'midwives' at the birth of CTC; and was among the 'Mayflower Six', – the chosen group of lecturers, at the start of the

college that was opened by the Anglican Church in 1965. For those who may not know, Church Teachers' College now occupies the property that once housed the Mayflower Hotel in Mandeville. In 1979, KenT succeeded Rt Reverend Dr William Murray, who was elected Suffragan Bishop of Mandeville, as principal, and served for another 17 years until his retirement in 1996.

Dr. Crossfield also noted that Dr Thaxter's 30 plus years impacted 31 cohorts or batches of women and men, including journalist and former deputy speaker of the House of Representatives Lloyd Smith; educator Avis Glaze; Jamaica's first female to be appointed training officer for the Jamaica Constabulary Force, Assistant Commissioner Jevene Bent; musician Sam Carty; radio personality Jennifer 'Jenny' Small; Justice Sheron Barnes; Archdeacon Patrick Cunningham; Rev Canon Dr Grace Jervis; and Audrey Tugwell Henry, president and CEO, Scotia Group Jamaica Limited.

Michael Andrews of the Florida-based alumni association described him as manifesting "the virtues of life and living with moral and intellectual clarity," and that "he was a social intellect who knew the power of respect," while past student and South Florida minister of religion Dr. Clyde Bailey calls him "a gentle giant, a humble personality of rare distinctions. His pedigree and noble character are rare."

# AMANDA HUTCHINSON, FORMER STUDENT OF ST. ANDREW HIGH SCHOOL FOR GIRLS, ONE OF SIX VALEDICTORIANS FOR THE CLASS OF 2022 AT BRANDON UNIVERSITY (CANADA) CONVOCATION

A total of six valedictorians, representing top academic achievement and community commitment from Brandon University's graduating students, was lauded at BU's Spring Convocation 2022 in May 2022.

Valedictorians were selected from every faculty and the School of Music, with the Faculty of Education selected two this year. They addressed their fellow graduates during four ceremonies across two days at this year's expanded Convocation.

Valedictorians, who were chosen for their academic excellence as well as their overall contributions to campus and community, brought greetings to their fellow graduates as well as a hopeful outlook at the future they will all share along with their brand-new knowledge and credentials.



Among the six chosen was **Amanda Hutchinson** who represented the faculty of Arts.

In 2017, after completing high school at St. Andrew High School for Girls, Amanda Hutchinson traveled by herself over 4097 km from Kingston, Jamaica, to Manitoba to attend Brandon University.

From the very beginning, she involved herself in university life, becoming a Floor Representative for her dorm Flora Cowan. Her academic commitment has been recognized through placement on the Dean's Honours List and the generous grant of academic scholarships.

Amanda has been a positive representation of the values of Brandon University through her published writing projects, in particular the UNESCO Sheroes Toolkit in 2021. She has advocated for Black Representation on campus, Mental Health and Gender Equity and will continue to do so going forward.

This is truly an achievement for Amanda who tells her story as follows.



Becoming a valedictorian was not what I had envisioned for myself. My high school experience had limited the ideas I had of myself, and of my capabilities. However, attending a university is an entirely different ballgame. It is a place where you are invited to change ideas of who you are, and of what you can do. In lectures I was not only learning new theories of life but discovering new perspectives of the type of person I could be. I had never had a passion for studies, but

that was because I was not passionate about my studies. Finding my love for sociology helped me to redefine myself and revealed a different path that was readily accessible to me.

Prior to attending Brandon University, the type of student I was had been defined to me, but this was the first time it would be defined by me. I could be creative, expressive and find my own way of doing things that fit me just fine. I found that learning could be fun, with just the right amount of interest and dedication to acquiring knowledge. Before long, I was considered a "good student", an example of what a commitment to academics could achieve; a valedictorian. To restate, I had not set out to be a valedictorian but suddenly it was all I wanted to be. I saw it each time I closed my eyes, myself up on the podium, delivering a heartfelt address and feeling a sense of pride at the thought of finally achieving my dream.

I am proud to say that I accomplished my goal. I became that version of me, minus the podium since my speech was delivered remotely. I learned a lot about myself in the process, and a lot about the idea of limitations. Limitations are inevitable, but they are not impossible to overcome. The limitations we place on ourselves are not unresolvable, they require a new perspective and focus to overcome. The goal we have is possible, if we work toward it steadily and keep our gaze fixed on the vision of who we want to be.

There is more to Amanda Hutchinson than her life at Brandon University these last years. She has delivered sermons at St. Andrew Parish Church. Amanda is hoping to become a college professor in the field of study that she loves so much, sociology, and we are certain that she will find a way to continue the discourse on the way that cultural narratives impact how young women are able to express themselves.


