- Pursuing an undergraduate degree in Management Information Systems or Computer Science or Computer Science with Management, or another closely related field at any campus at The University of the West Indies.
- Rank: 2nd year or higher
- GPA Criteria (≥ 3.0)
- Record of community service related to education.
