The annual public speaking competition showcased the talents of three exceptional finalists representing Hampton School, Manning's School, and Montego Bay High School. Lewison will represent Jamaica at the Caribbean Tourism Organisation's Youth Congress scheduled for October in Barbados, continuing Jamaica's tradition of grooming excellent young tourism ambassadors.

The runner-up title was awarded to Kaira Bowman of Montego Bay High School, while Jullisa Dujon of Manning's School also received high commendation for their impressive performance during the finals.

Seaforth High School has claimed first place in the European Union (EU) and Universal Service Fund (USF) ICT Club Video Competition, earning top honours for their digital storytelling project and securing an all-expenses-paid trip to Brussels later this summer.

The award ceremony, held on July 15, showcased the creativity and innovation of Jamaican students as they explored the theme of technology's impact on future careers and how the education system can better prepare youth for the digital economy. The competition, open to students in Grades 11–13 who are members of USF ICT Clubs, forms part of a wider initiative by the EU, the USF, and e-Learning Jamaica to promote digital inclusion and skills development.

Old Harbour High School and St Hilda's Diocesan High School placed second and third, respectively, in a strong field of entries that reflected the talents and forward-thinking mindset of Jamaican youth.
