The Coalition of Jamaican Alumni Associations of Florida is proud to celebrate the achievement of **Samantha Collie**, who this summer completed her MSc in Translational Medicine at the Universitat de Barcelona at just 20 years old.

Her research examined CFTR modulation and its role in pancreatic cancer, an area of study with the potential to shape future treatments. She credits her success to the guidance of her mentor, Eva Vaquero, and the challenges of the project itself. Reflecting on the experience, Samantha said, "I feel lucky to have had the opportunity to take on this challenge early in my journey, and I'm excited to carry these skills forward into the long clinical road ahead." She is now applying to medical schools with the goal of pursuing a career in medicine.

Samantha comes from a family with deep educational ties to Jamaica. Her mother, Pat Montague Collie, is a graduate of Wolmer's and the University of the West Indies (UWI). Her father, Chris Collie, a graduate of Hocking College, Partner at Engaged Talent Solutions, and alumnus of Cornwall College, has also played an important role in shaping her commitment to learning. Their support and legacy have been central to her drive and success.
