

Are Our Donations Through the National Education Trust (NET) in Trouble?

This article below appeared in Jamaica's Daily Gleaner on September 29, 2025:

"Overseas-Based JC Old Boys Urge Holness to Step In, Address Onerous New Donor Requirements"

Members of the Jamaican diaspora in the United States and Canada have described as onerous and an unexpected hurdle new requirements from the National Education Trust (NET) governing donations being made by alumni associations to their alma maters in Jamaica.

The new requirement surfaced recently when the Jamaica College Old Boys' Association (JCOBA) of New York shipped to Jamaica College computers and robotic kits for students at the school.

A new donor verification form was sent to the organisation asking for, among other things, the names, emails, phone numbers, nationality and addresses of owners and directors in the organisation. The JCOBA was also told to send a copy of the board's resolution authorising the donation, as well as provide information on the organisation's bank account and the source of funds used to finance the donation.

The form also asked for certified bank statements no

older than three months, written declaration of source of funds, plus "evidence of the transactions from which the charitable donations were derived (e.g. certified copy of property sale agreement, grant of probate and will or shared purchase agreement)."

It further requested that all documents must be certified by a justice of the peace or a notary public. The form from the NET comes as part of the Department of Cooperatives and Friendly Societies – Charities Act Donors Registry.

Tradition under threat

In a letter to Prime Minister Dr Andrew Holness, the JCOBA chapters in New York, Florida and Canada asked him to urgently review the new requirements.

In their letter, the JCOBA chapters said the proud tradition of partnership with Jamaica was now under threat.

"[While] we fully support Jamaica's compliance with international anti-money laundering standards, the current donor registration requirements appear to exceed what is necessary for such compliance," the association said in its letter.

"We respectfully urge your immediate intervention. The delayed shipment will prevent Jamaica College students from adequately preparing for international competition and will compromise their role in training other Jamaica robotics teams."

The Gleaner understands that other alumni associations across the Diaspora will also be asking for the prime minister's intervention in the matter.

In an earlier correspondence to the NET, the JCOBA said that, while it had no objection in principle to the establishment of a local donor registry, the request raises serious concerns regarding the nature and scope of the personally identifiable information being requested about the directors of the corporation.

"The details sought – such as home addresses, nationality, personal phone numbers and private email addresses – appear excessive, bear no apparent connection to the donor activities and are being collected through Google – a platform that lacks end-to-end encryption and therefore is inconsistent with established best practices for safeguarding sensitive data," the letter stated.

Further, the letter pointed out that the organisation is unable to "identify any provision of the Charities Act that authorises this request of a non-profit corporation organised under US law".

Chilling effect

Michelle Tulloch-Neil, member of the Global Jamaica Diaspora Council for the US Northeast Region, said she only became aware of the new requirement when it was brought to her attention by the JCOBA.

Kudos to the JCOBA chapters in New York, Florida and Canada for writing the letter seeking the Prime Minister's intervention as we know the importance of donations from the alumni community to our institutions in Jamaica.



UWI TO HONOUR MARCIA GRIFFITHS WITH HONORARY DOCTORATE

The University of the West Indies (The UWI) is set to continue its tradition of recognizing exceptional individuals who have made significant contributions to their fields. During the 2025 graduation ceremonies, 11 distinguished graduates will be awarded honorary degrees.

Veteran reggae artiste Marcia Griffiths will receive the honorary Doctor of Letters degree (DLitt) for her work in music, culture, and the empowerment of women. Hailing from West Kingston, Griffiths has left her mark on the reggae scene over a span of six decades.

One of reggae's most celebrated and enduring voices, Marcia was crowned the Queen of Reggae for her artistry, innovation, and commitment, which helped shape the genre from its early days to the global stage.

Starting her musical career in 1964 alongside Byron Lee and The Dragonaires, she honed her skills under the tutelage of Phillip "Boasie" James of The Blues Busters, and Clement "Coxsone" Dodd at Studio One. Soon, she became a household name in 1970 when she joined Bob Marley and the Wailers as part of the legendary I-Three singing group. Her solo success flourished with tracks like *Stepping Out a Babylon* and a collaboration in 1982 with Bunny Wailer when they recorded *Electric Boogie*, which sparked a worldwide dance craze.

Griffiths has recorded 19 solo albums, five duet albums (with Bob Andy), and numerous collaborations, including the Penthouse Records hits like *I Shall Sing* and *Fire Burning*. Her contributions have been recognised with top national honours — the Order of Jamaica in 2023, the Order of Distinction in 1994 with elevation to the Commander Class in 2014. These accolades highlight her role as both a cultural ambassador and a pioneering woman in reggae.

Her mission, as she states, is not only to entertain but to "reach out to touch souls, to teach, educate, and uplift".

The Mona Campus will also honour the late Don Wehby, Bishop Robert Clarke, and Professor Gene D Morse.

This year's honorary graduands represent a diverse range of professions, each bringing decades of experience and impactful contributions in fields such as music, agriculture, religion, science and research, and aviation. The UWI Council approved the decision to honour these individuals, reflecting the institution's commitment to celebrating excellence and innovation.

These ceremonies are scheduled to take place from October 11 to November 8, 2025, across the five UWI campuses.


