Margaret Barrett, Past president and current secretary of the University of the West Indies Alumni Association-Florida Chapter (UWIAA-FL) died October 13, 2017. She was also the former chief administrator of Jamaica National Building Society's office in Tamarac.

A past student of Ferncourt High School in Jamaica, Margaret also studied at the University of the West Indies where she earned both the Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees majoring in Sociology and Human Resource Management respectively.

Margaret was very active in the community and was a stalwart of UWIAA-FL. At the time of her death, she was also a member of the Consul General of the Southern USA 2017 Awards committee. An ardent supporter of the umbrella organization for Jamaican alumni associations in Florida, Margaret never missed any of the annual walkathon.

Margaret will be sadly missed. We will cherish the memories of the times with her and honor her tremendous legacy of service.

OLYMPIAN TAKES CHARGE OF SPORT AT UWI ST AUGUSTINE

October 25, 2017 St. Augustine



Jamaican Olympian Grace Jackson has been appointed Director of Sport at The University of the West Indies, St. Augustine Campus effective September 30, 2017.

A celebrated track and field athlete, Jackson won silver in the 200m at the 1988 Seoul Olympics Games and competed in the 1984, 1988 and 1992 Olympic Games. She also won gold in the 4x400m relay at the 1989 World Games.

She was Jamaica's Sportswoman of the Year in 1986 and 1988. In 1989 she was awarded the Order of Distinction (OD) by the Government of Jamaica along with several other prestigious awards.

Grace Jackson was formerly at The UWI Mona where she held the position of Sports Development Director from 2010. Before this, she served as Student Services and Development Manager, Sports from 1998 to 2009 also at the Mona campus. She graduated with a BA in Accounting from Alabama, Agricultural and Mechanical University in 1982 and then completed a MA in Computer Science at Queens College in 1987. In 2007, she graduated from the United States Sports Academy, Mobile Alabama with a Master of Sports Science and Sports Management. Jackson has been a regular commentator and analyst on television and radio since 1992 and has acted as lead Caribbean analyst on athletics at the Olympic level for ESPN Caribbean.

Commenting on her new appointment the Director of Sport said "I am no stranger to The UWI and when I consider advancements at the institution like the establishment of the Faculty of Sport I am pleased with the high priority we are placing on the discipline. It is a good time to take up a leadership position in Sport at The UWI St. Augustine and I look forward to making a significant contribution." Jackson will oversee

her first edition of the UWI SPEC International Half-Marathon which takes place on October 29.

I attended the Jamaica 55th Diaspora Conference, "Partnering for Growth" 23-26 July in Kingston, Jamaica. The conference focused on Jamaica's economic growth agenda and the strategic engagement of Diasporans in the process. Over 1,200 registrants participated in plenary and breakout sessions that featured outstanding speakers from the Caribbean and elsewhere. For example, Dr. Julius Garvey (Son of Marcus Josiah Garvey), a Cardio-Thoracic Surgeon and Executive Director of Operations, Farm Up Jamaica, USA Speaking at the Agriculture Plenary Session; Jamaica's former Prime Minister, The Most Honorable P.J. Patterson, and Professor Sir Hilary Beckles Vice-Chancellor attended and were session speakers at the conference.

It was an honor for me to attend as the Florida Chapter's president and to witness first-hand on July 26, the launching of the launching of UWI's Faculty of Sport with Dr. Akshai Mansingh, named to be the dean. We know how important sporting events are to the social fabric and culture of the Caribbean and this was indeed a great addition to the University of the West Indies.

I visited the campus with had beautiful Royal Poincinas in full bloom all over. Other interesting sites that I visited included the park in honor of UWI graduates who are or were Heads of Governments, the Usain Bolt Track, the old and new Halls of Residence, the bookstore, the museum, Chapel Gardens, and the Aqueducts. Visiting the Campus certainly bring back fond memories and I am suggesting that the next time you are in Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago or Barbados, pay a visit to the UWI campus. You will be glad you did!

SUNY / UNIVERSITY OF THE WEST INDIES PARTNERSHIP



The UB Center for Integrated Global Biomedical Sciences (CIGBS) will be working with the SUNY Global Health Institute (GHI) to build research opportunities in Jamaica and the Caribbean region. An infectious diseases research center is a high priority for the SUNY—University of the West Indies (UWI) collaboration.

Enabling Jamaica to become a regional hub, the research will focus on microbiologic, immunologic and pharmacologic aspects related to detection, epidemiology, diagnostics, treatment and prevention of infectious diseases. It will partner with programs such as the Global Virus Network, WHO and Global Fund and network with the diabetes, digestive and liver disease and nanomedicine programs.
