### JAMAICA EX-POLICE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC. (JEPA), ANNUAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS



To show its commitment to the community and education, and to display and encourage community involvement, the Jamaica Ex-Police Association of Florida will be offering two (2) one-time scholarship in May 2023. **JEPA's USA Scholarship** will be awarded to a college student who resides in either Miami-Dade, Broward or Palm Beach County. **JEPA's Jamaica scholarship** will be awarded to a high school student who resides in Jamaica.

#### **Criteria for obtaining USA Scholarship**:

- 1. Applicants **MUST** be legal residents of Broward, Miami-Dade or Palm Beach County, Florida.
- 2. Applicants **MUST** provide proof of residency.
- 3. Applicants must be currently enrolled or accepted as a student in a 2-4-year college.
- 4. Applicants **MUST** submit a two-page essay (81/2 x 11), typed in 12-inch font with double spacing, explaining convincingly why he/she should be awarded this scholarship.
- 5. Application packets **MUST** include the applicant's full name, address, telephone number, and email address.
- 6. Students of Jamaican parentage residing in Florida counties listed above are strongly encouraged to apply.
- 7. The financial need and scholastic aptitude of the applicants will be considered in the selection process.
- 8. Deadline for all applications is May 1, 2023.
- 9. Applications must be mailed to The Jamaica Ex-Police Association of South Florida Inc., 7153 West Oakland Park Boulevard, Lauderhill, FL 33313.
- 10. Applications must also be submitted electronically to:

#### **Criteria for obtaining Jamaican Scholarship:**

- 1. Applicants **MUST** be a high school student or **MUST** have been accepted in a Jamaican high school.
- 2. The Community Relations Division of the JCF will select the recipient.
- 3. The scholarship is a onetime cash award.
- 4. Money awarded should be used **ONLY** to purchase school supplies e.g., books and uniforms.
- 5. Over a one-year period, the funds will be disbursed by the principal or designee.
- 6. The principal (or designee) of the recipient's school will administer the funds and submit an expenditure report to the Jamaica Ex-Police Association of South Florida, Inc. via the Community Relations and Security Division of the Jamaica Constabulary Force.

- 7. For the one-year period of the scholarship, recipients must attend school regularly, and maintain satisfactory academic performance and conduct.
- 8. The decision of the Scholarship Awards Committee is final.
- 9. Applications must also be submitted electronically to:

#### **Procedure**:

- 1. The Scholarship Committee will review applications and choose, based on academics, aptitude and community involvement.
- 2. Selection of the recipient will be done prior to May 15, 2023, and the recipient will be informed prior to May 27, 2023.
- 3. The scholarship presentation will be at JEPA's 31st Anniversary Ball on May 27, 2023. Scholarship recipients and chaperones will be invited as guests.
- 4. The president of JEPA or his designee will hand out the scholarship to the recipient.

#### WATERFORD HIGH NEEDS FUNDS FOR FEEDING PROGRAMME, SCHOOL BUS

Constance Curriah, principal of Waterford High School in Portmore, St Catherine is appealing to the public for assistance in funding the institution's feeding programme and obtaining a bus to transport students to and from sporting and other extra-curricular events.

According to Curriah, 280 of her students are on the Programme of Advancement Through Health and Education (PATH) while another 100 are signed up with the school's welfare programme. Those on PATH are sup-

posed to get subsidised lunch three days per week. However, Curriah and her administration put a system in place that allowed the roughly 400 students to receive lunch five days per week. But since February the school has had to cut the number of days from five to three, and that reality worries Curriah.

"We are really short of money so we have an issue in terms of feeding the students. The Government does provide PATH but it is only \$150 per day for three days, and that is really not enough. I am really appealing to Jamaica in general for any assistance in terms of providing funds or foodstuff to feed the children. The 100 welfare students are not on PATH but I have always been feeding them five days per week, but it has been costing us.

"The challenge now is that with the financial issues we are having, we cannot continue to feed them for five days and so we cut it down to three. Some parents can't find the money, so even though PATH only covers three days, there is an additional two days. Even though some of the students are on PATH, some parents would give still give them money. What we ask them to do is use the little extra to ensure they come to school on Thursdays and Fridays," Curriah said.

"I would like to return to the five days because it means that there may be students absent on Thursday and Friday because they don't have lunch. For some students, the PATH lunch is the only meal they get for the day. Some of our students live in deplorable condi-

tions and/or they have no caring parent or guardian. When I feed them for five days, I know they get something substantial. When I have to cut the days down to three, it bothers me," she added. As it relates to the school's need for a bus, Curriah said that transporting the students to sporting and other events "can be expensive".

"My head of science advised me that there is a science fair at the University of Technology and transportation is basically anywhere between \$25,000 to \$30,000. Every time the students have to go anywhere, we have a serious issue in terms of money. Going into Kingston every time for track meets and then when Champs starts, it costs us \$20,000 to \$25,000 per day. If you're going to Spanish Town it is \$15,000, and if you're going into Kingston it is \$25,000. For extra-curricular, our school-based assessment trip goes on the coast, so if we are going to Portland or St Thomas you know that is going to cost us about \$45,000. We wouldn't need to be finding that money if we had a school bus; all we would need to find is gas. We really need the assistance."

#### TEARS OF JOY AS MANNING'S SCHOOL GETS STEM LAB

Jamaican philanthropist, innovative entrepreneur, and economic development advisor Victor Lowe was moved to tears last Friday as his dream of seeing a science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) laboratory opened at his alma mater, The Manning's School, became a reality.

Lowe, the main benefactor of the STEM lab, said it was a good day, and that science, technology, engineering, and mathematics are academic disciplines that are front and centre in the world today. He told the students that the world is their oyster, and that they should never forget that.

"The STEM centre is nothing more than a vessel. Members of staff are needed to guide these young and capable minds — the passengers — in making this vessel fully functional and worthy of its intent," said Lowe.

The centre will facilitate the launch of the 285-year-old high school's ambitious 'Brain STEM' programme. Through this initiative students from all grades at the school will have the opportunity to incorporate robotics, coding, and general science, along with mathematics and engineering, into their curriculum. In her address, Minister of Education and Youth Fayval Williams welcomed the opening of the facility which has been dubbed the Victor Lowe STEM Centre. Speaking at the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the STEM lab, Williams was effusive as she welcomed the addition to the Manning's curriculum.

"I am really excited for this focus here on STEM education," said Williams as she pointed out that Jamaica's education system has been on a transformation track for a number of years.


"The Ministry of Education and Youth is committed to providing and enabling an environment that prepares our students to take their place as global citizens. We see it as our duty to build a school network that is adaptable and dynamic, yet cohesive," added Williams.

In the meantime, chairman of the Manning's High School Board, Moses Chybar expressed gratitude to those who contributed to the state-of-the-art facility.

"We are really grateful, first of all, for the STEM centre being established and we are grateful for the persons who contributed before — the past students' association (the Florida chapter, the New York chapter), most of all Victor Lowe who has single-handedly contributed well over \$50 million to the project," Chybar said.

Jamaica National Bank also donated \$1 million to the project during the ceremony and Chybar said that contribution was "quite a bit of gravy". He noted that the building will now need technological equipment to retrofit the centre, and that the school welcomes additional funding.






